On target for completion in 2026, <u>Eternal Wall of Answered Prayer</u> will be the largest database of hope stories in the world. Aspiring to ignite faith for prayer on a global level, the vision for the inspiring structure began over 19 years ago when founder, Richard Gamble, felt guided by the Holy Spirit to build an international icon dedicated to answered prayer.

The striking new art structure will be constructed using one million white bricks, each recounting an individual's personal answered prayer. Digitally linked to a specific location in the monument, visitors will be able to hold their phone up to a brick and discover the specific answered prayer it represents with either audio, video or text.

Designed as a stunning infinity loop with neither beginning nor end, the colossal piece of architecture will stand at 169ft (51.5m) in Coleshill, Birmingham, 90 miles north of London, visible from nearly six miles away. An estimated 500,000 people will travel past the monument every week, and a projected 200,000 people will visit the site annually.

Eternal Wall of Answered Prayer has already gathered answered prayers representing over 85 countries and hopes to acquire 80,000 more from the United States. Serving as a reminder that God has faithfully and powerfully moved throughout history, the Eternal Wall will include 75,000 "heritage bricks" to celebrate and preserve answered prayers dating as far back as 600 AD.

Every one of the million answered prayers represented on the Eternal Wall will be accessible online, for free. Virtual guests can type in whatever situation or storm of life they're going through and discover personal accounts detailing how God answered. Visitors with a faith background and those without will be encouraged by the many testimonies of God's faithfulness and perhaps even inspired to activate prayer in their own
